

Storm Breaker (Mark Part 29)

³⁵ As evening came, Jesus said to his disciples, “**Let’s cross** to the other side of the lake.” ³⁶ So they took Jesus in the boat and started out, leaving the crowds behind (although **other boats followed**).

³⁷ But soon a fierce storm came up. High waves were breaking into the boat, and it began to fill with water.

³⁸ Jesus was sleeping at the back of the boat with his head on a cushion. The disciples woke him up, shouting, “Teacher, don’t you care that we’re going to drown?”

³⁹ When Jesus woke up, he **rebuked the wind** and said to the waves, “Silence! Be still!” Suddenly the wind stopped, and there was **a great calm**. ⁴⁰ Then he asked them, “Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?”

⁴¹ The disciples were absolutely terrified. “Who is this man?” they asked each other. “Even the wind and waves obey him!” (Mark 4:35–41 NLT)
